THE MASTERMIND (12A)



Giddy and excited, 15-year-olds Doe and Muna are going on the trip of a lifetime. They're not going on holiday, though – they're travelling to Istanbul, then across the border to start a new life in Syria, a journey that will test their resolve, their faith and their friendship.

The screening on Thursday 9 October will feature a post-screening discussion.


